

Nationwide Survey of Parents of K-12 Students & School Administrators on:

Perceptions of School-Based Mental Health

Methodology

- John Zogby Strategies was commissioned by Effective School Solutions to conduct a nationwide, online survey of 1,000 parents with children enrolled in K-12, and 200 school administrators.
- John Zogby Strategies conducted these surveys October 25 through November 3.
- Each invitation was passwordcoded and secured so the IP addresses were not tracked and to prevent each respondent from taking the survey more than once.

- Overall margins of error include +/- 3.2 percentage points for the survey of parents and +/- 7.1 percentage points for the school administrators. Subsets of the data have higher error margins.
- Additional factors such as question wording and question order - can create error. JZS took steps to reduce such error.

Key Takeaways


- High percentages of school administrators across the board say they are facing a severe/significant level of mental health problems in their schools.
- A significant majority of parents report that they believe the level of mental health problems in their child's school is severe, significant, or moderate.

- Nearly half of parents and educators say they are concerned about not enough staff to address student needs, and administrators are concerned about lack of funding for mental health.
- More than half of administrators said they need more information about funding sources for school-based mental health.





How would you describe the level of mental health challenges in your school?






Nearly 90% of administrators describe mental health challenges in schools as moderate to severe.



How does the level of mental health challenges for your student body compare to one year ago?






Nearly 3/5 of administrators believe mental health challenges among students have increased or stayed the same year over year.



How does the level of mental health challenges for your student body compare to one year ago? [by location]






In rural areas, 55% of administrators describe the level of mental health challenges for the student body to be significantly worse than a year ago.



Overall, how confident are you in staff ability to deal with mental health challenges in your school(s)?






Only 40% of administrators report a high level of confidence in the ability of their schools to deal with mental health challenges.



How Would You Describe Your Level of Awareness of Funding Sources for Mental Health in Your School District?






More than 50% of administrators need more information about funding sources for school-based mental health.



Top Concerns among Admin [select all that apply]






Administrators report student identification and sufficient staffing as their major pain points.



Initiatives in Place to Support Student Mental Health [select all that apply]






Despite stated priorities, only 44% of districts are using screening and only 63% have put in place additional counseling.



Do You Feel Your Schools Implement Best Practices Around Mental Health?






While 75% of administrators believe that their schools implement best practices around mental health, only 45% of parents concur with that statement. See slide 17 for comparison







How would you describe the level of mental health challenges in your school?






Nearly 60% of parents describe mental health challenges in schools as moderate to severe.



How significant a role should your child's school play in supporting student mental health?






Over 80% of parents state that schools should play a role in supporting mental health with almost 40% stating that this should be a significant role.




Do You Feel Your Child's School Implements Best Practices Around Mental Health?





Overall, how confident are you in school's staff ability to deal with mental health challenges in your child's school?






<u>See, slide 9 for comparison</u>. Note, 40% of administrators are confident in school's staff to deal with mental health challenges vs. roughly 31% of parents.
